Who can participate?

All school centres that wish can participate forming teams. The participation is by classes. Each class is one team. Each school center can participate with so many teams they wish. Each class or team has to start one travelling notebook. The subject is free but has to be related to Consumer Education.

What type of notebook?

A physical notebook (with sheets and the form that each team considers adequate) which the teachers will initiate with pictures and texts and that will help as guidance for the remaining participants. The teachers will start the travelling notebook with a title (decided in the classroom) that will be the page number 1. Furthermore, the two next pages (number 2 and 3) will be used to show the subject about which the travelling notebook should talk.

How does the notebook travel?

Every two or three days, the teachers will give the notebook to one (different) pupil who will take it home and complete two pages with images, cut-outs, pictures, etc. related to the selected subject together with its parents and/or grandparents and/or sisters and brothers. Then the pupil will bring the notebook back to school, talk about it in the classroom and hand it over to the teacher who will give it to another pupil to continue the wheel.

When does the notebook finish the travel?

The travel finishes after the notebook has visited the homes of all families. The last two or three pages will also be completed by the teachers including the index and a final summary.

What to do with the travelling notebooks?

The physical travelling notebooks should be sent to the European School of Consumers before May 2009 or can be scanned and sent to the E-CONS NETWORK by e-mail.

Why is it travelling?

Because every week, the notebook will travel to one or various homes where it will be completed by the families (together with the pupils). Each family has two pages.

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
